1<sup>st</sup> Vice President Roy Casto called the meeting to order at 10am, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance led by Sergeant of Arms Bob Reddington.

Greg Hazard, with the Pinal County Attorney's Office presented training on Evidence handling from a Prosecutions standpoint.

President Nancy McKay-Hills took over the meeting at the conclusion of Greg's training. She announced the minutes from the last quarterly meeting in December were sent out in advance for review. Sandie Imberi moved that the minutes be accepted as written, seconded by Roy Casto. The members of the association approved the motion.

### **Old business:**

Legislative Committee-Chairman Roy Casto announced HB2371 passed the House and has passed through the judicial committee in the Senate. Roy encouraged every member to write his or her local senator in support of the bill.
